

1 Thessalonians - True Life is Impossible Without God  
(Part 6) What is the Hope of Christianity?

We live in a time when many people lack\_\_\_\_\_.

Can anyone offer hope to those whose loved ones have died while \_\_\_\_\_ from the grace and mercy of God?  
(John 11:26)

Paul is about to answer questions and a certain amount of \_\_\_\_\_ some were having regarding their loved ones who had died.

They were expecting the return of the Lord at any time, but what about those loved ones who had died since \_\_\_\_\_ Christ?

The \_\_\_\_\_ world had no real hope of life after death.

‘I was not, I became, I am not, I care not.’

The \_\_\_\_\_ life is quite frankly a life without hope.

It stubbornly fixes its attention on the \_\_\_\_\_ and avoids the distraction of the\_\_\_\_\_.

The Christians in Thessalonica \_\_\_\_\_ that their Christian friends and loved ones who had died would be shut out of the Messiah’s kingdom

They mourned for them as those mourn who have no\_\_\_\_\_.

(1 Thess. 4:13-18) Paul offers hope

Death is not the \_\_\_\_\_

The state of \_\_\_\_\_ is changed

There will be an \_\_\_\_\_ from death in a resurrection

There will be a rejuvenation of bodily \_\_\_\_\_ in the resurrection.

The soul and spirit of the deceased needs to be reunited with the body (2 Corinthians 5:8)

Jesus said if we believed in Him, we will never really \_\_\_\_\_ (John 11:25-26).

We may experience a separation from our physical body, but we will never be separated from\_\_\_\_\_.

Death does not break the bond between the believing \_\_\_\_\_ and the Savior.

Paul’s intention was to provide them with enough information to prevent their needless \_\_\_\_\_ and pain over the deaths of their Christian brothers and sisters.
