As apostasy reaches its height in the last days, it finds its representative and, in "the man of sin", or" the man of lawlessness." (2 Thessalonians 2:3)
There are only three passages in the new testament that specifically mention the,
All in the letters of John (I John 2.18-27, I John 4.1-6, 2 John 7)
Antichrist – "or in opposition to Christ"
The "son of perdition" (KJV) – son of (eternal damnation, utter destruction)
The "abomination of desolation" (detestable one who causes destruction) (Daniel 9:26-27; Matthew 24:15-16
The book of Revelation describes a singular figure as "the beast from the earth" whose number is 666. (Rev.13:11-18)
He leads worship offor the "the beast from the sea" (Revelation 13:1-10)
When Paul says the man of sin, he means the man (2 Thess. 2:3-4)
Not a principle, nor a, nor a series of persons, but anhuman person with sin by his very nature
An incarnation of as Christ was of good
He is the ultimate adversary, he who sets himself in opposition, a human, the enemy of Christ.
The man of sin is filled with demonic
He lifts himself on high against the God, and all gods, and all that men adore
He seats himself in the temple of God and he to be accepted by all men as God.
First, there must be the of the power which holds the man of sin in check;
Then the culmination of evil will affect the entirety of the earth.
