(Part 36) Giving to the Lord with a Pure Heart

Jesus had dealt with several confrontations during his third trip to the Temple in Jerusalem. (Mark 12:12-40)

He was challenged regarding His \_\_\_\_\_ by the Pharisees and Herodians concerning taxes.

The Sadducees attacked immediately after that raising a question concerning His \_\_\_\_\_ on resurrection
