

Hebrews – Jesus is the High Priest of the Perfect Covenant  
(Part 15) Once for All and Once Forever

Hebrews chapter 9 may seem a little confusing to we who are removed two thousand years from first century Judaism  
(Hebrews 9:1-10) Original worship \_\_\_\_\_ between God and Israel.

(v.1) The Tabernacle was the place God determined he would be worshipped.

Both the Tabernacle and its furnishings point toward the \_\_\_\_\_ Holiness of God.

Because of the sinfulness of mankind, it also pointed out the \_\_\_\_\_ between God and man.

(v.2-8) Moses' Tabernacle had three basic parts or rooms, the courtyard, the Holy Place, and the Holy of Holies.

The courtyard is where people brought their \_\_\_\_\_.

The Holy place was curtained off and only accessible to the \_\_\_\_\_ and descendants of Levi.

The Holy of Holies was likewise curtained off and was only accessible to the High priest \_\_\_\_\_ per year.

The high priest had to atone for his own sins before entering the Holy of Holies.

He also sacrificed animals to cover the \_\_\_\_\_ of the people.

(v.9-10) The old covenant and animal sacrifices were unable to cleanse the conscience of the people.

Conscience gives us a \_\_\_\_\_ sense of right and wrong.

Their consciences told them that they were not forgiven unless they \_\_\_\_\_ something \_\_\_\_\_ their salvation.

(Hebrews 9:11-28) The old covenant is obsolete.

(v.11-12) There is no longer a need for animal sacrifices – Christ offered himself as a \_\_\_\_\_ sacrifice.

(v.13-15) The sacrifice of Jesus sets people free from sin and allows them to worship God \_\_\_\_\_.

Jesus offers an inheritance of eternal life guaranteed by God.

(v.16-22) For inheritance to be a reality \_\_\_\_\_ must occur.

The promises of forgiveness in the old covenant were made possible through the death of \_\_\_\_\_.

The blood confirms the covenant, because without the shedding of blood there is no forgiveness.

(Leviticus 19:11; Hebrews 9:22)

(v.23-26) Unlike the priest who had to repeatedly make sacrifices, Jesus is the once for all sacrifice.

(v.27-28) Everyone \_\_\_\_\_, and everyone faces \_\_\_\_\_.

Jesus died once to bring salvation to all who belong to him.

When he comes back, everyone will already be judged (John 3:16-21).

Why did Jesus shed His holy blood and die such a horrible death?

He died to obtain eternal redemption for true believers in Christ.
